





FRIENDLY REMINDER FROM THE ARCHITECTURAL COMMITTEE

The Architectural Committee guidelines are intended to maintain the quality, appearance and protect the values of all Gull Aire Village properties. These guidelines specify that approval by the GAVA Architectural Committee or the GAVA Board of Directors is required for any changes to the exterior of all Gull Aire Village homes and properties. Residents can access the guidelines on the Gull Aire website (www.gullairevillage.org) under documents, or they can pick them up in the GAVA clubhouse.

This month's reminder, APPLICATION REQUEST AND APPROVAL ARE REQUIRED FOR THE FOLLOWING:

FENCES: Fences must be picket style constructed of white PVC material. Fence may not exceed 48" in height. Sides of fence may not exceed the rear width of the home and the rear fence must not extend beyond the back-property line. Fencing on side or front yards is prohibited. No fencing can restrict access to utility easements or right of way. City permit is required.

OUTSIDE PAINTING: Any painting done to the outside of your home or driveway requires an application.

TRIVIA ANSWER

While generally attributed to Henry Ford, the first Auto Assembly Line was used by our town's founder - Ransom Eli OLDS. Mr. Olds patented the assembly line concept and used it to produce the Oldsmobile Curved Dash vehicle at the Olds Motor Vehicle Company of Lansing, Michigan in 1901. The Olds assembly line was considered a "stationary line" while the line first used by Ford in 1913 was a "moving assembly line". Ransom Olds first tinkered with a gasoline powered car as early as 1896. His Lansing company later moved to Detroit under the Olds Motor Works name and was purchased by the upstart General Motors in 1908.
