

President's Letter

This month we have our annual meeting and residents will have the opportunity to vote to fill two vacant positions on the board. You can vote ahead of time via mail or in person prior to the start of the annual meeting.

The board will be repainting the lines in the RV lot to better define the spots and will replace the numbers which are missing in some of the spaces. The weeds have been removed and the lots look much better. However, someone dumped a water heater and a cooling unit in the RV lot off Salmon Court. Contractors usually haul these items away, so I hope they were not dumped by one of our residents. These two items will be disposed of properly.

The spa jets are working as they should, and we hired a leak detector company to see if they could find where the water was leaking. They were successful! A temporary repair has been done and we will discuss a permanent repair at a future meeting but for now the spa is back to normal.

With the start of a new fiscal year, I thought it might be a suitable time to briefly review some of our rules.

Pool badges. Residents are to have a pool badge anytime they are in the pool area.

Architectural Committee approval. Before you start any project check the AC guidelines. Guidelines and approval forms are available from the clubhouse.

Speed limit. The speed limit is 20 mph not 25.

Residency Requirements. No person less than 18 years of age shall be a permanent occupant in any of the units. At least one occupant in the home is to be 55 years of age or older and all occupants must pass a background check.

Motorhomes, RV's & Trailers. Recreational vehicles may be parked on the driveway or in front of the home for up to 48 consecutive hours for the purpose of loading and unloading or cleaning the same. Staying and sleeping in RV's is prohibited.

Feeding Wildlife. Feeding wildlife including fish, birds, and alligators around any of the ponds or common grounds in GAV is prohibited.

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





Did you know about these bicycle regulations according to the Florida Statue!


<u>316.2065</u> Bicycle regulations.—

(7) Every bicycle in use between **sunset and sunrise shall be equipped with a lamp on the front** exhibiting a white light visible from a distance of at least 500 feet to the front and a **lamp and reflector on the rear each exhibiting a red light** visible from a distance of 600 feet to the rear. A bicycle or its rider may be equipped with lights or reflectors in addition to those required by this section. A law enforcement officer may issue a bicycle safety brochure and a verbal warning to a bicycle rider who violates this subsection or may issue a citation and assess a fine for a pedestrian violation as provided in s. <u>318.18</u>.

(9) A person propelling a vehicle by human power **upon and along a sidewalk**, or across a roadway upon and along a crosswalk, has all the rights and duties applicable to a pedestrian under the same circumstances.

(10) A person propelling a bicycle <u>upon and</u> <u>along a sidewalk</u>, or across a roadway upon and along a crosswalk, shall yield the right-ofway to any pedestrian and shall give an audible signal before overtaking and passing such pedestrian.
