



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**HOA President's Letter** 

Welcome to another wonderful year in our community. Our community is more than just a place to live; it is a vibrant, dynamic environment where families can grow, friendships can flourish, and memories can be made.

I want to thank Tim Farmer for volunteering his time over the past two years as our treasurer and wish him well. Thanks Tim!

Also, as you may have noticed the Tarpon Crossing project is in full gear. As the project continues, we plan to provide updates for you on the progress.



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

GULL AIRE is a reality. Effective March 26, 1980, 164 spaces of the 493 spaces in Phase I were ready for occupancy. The remaining 329 Homesites will be available for occupancy as soon as services, streets and sidewalks are completed and accepted by the City and dedicated. We anticipate completion of these services within the next few months and will attempt to carefully coordinate this activity with each individual's desired move-in schedule. We will call each of you to tell you how we stand and work with you. We have begun construction of the Recreation Center (Clubhouse). We have also issued contracts of our Pool and Shuffleboard. While we have no firm completion schedule for the total Recreation area, we have targeted early Summer for completion. In our continuing attempt to abide by your wishes, we have eliminated the Tennis Courts and will establish a more functional and useful area which will include a Mini-park, Barbecue areas, Picnic tables, Horseshoes, etc. As we get firmer schedules, we will be sure to keep you informed.

GULL AIRE VILLAGE is proud to announce the appointment of Robert Zegota as Vice President of Sales for Mobile Homes. Bob comes to us from Commodore Corporation, where he was regional Sales Manager for three years. ## Gull Aire Village March Update (Feb. 7, 2025)



A 160-ton crane is used to set the iron sheets into the sheeting machine.



Rows of 54-inch HDPE pipe are stacked in the Safety Harbor laydown yard. These will be fused and pulled through the tunnel under the canal.



The sheeting machine gently pushes the iron sheeting into the ground with little to no vibration and very little noise.



A row of the iron sheeting has been installed along the perimeter to shore up the area where the horizontal directional drill sending pit will be. In the foreground, what look like Paul Bunyon-size railroad ties are crane mats. These protect pipe underneath from the weight of the crane.

Construction for the St. Pete Tarpon Outfall Aerial Crossing project has gotten underway. So far, the trees have been removed from the easement work zone, gravel and crane mats have been installed, and the iron sheeting to shore up the ground around the water pipe has been put in place.

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




