

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
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#### HISTORY MINUTES




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### St. Pete Tarpon Canal Crossing Update

The St. Pete Tarpon Canal Crossing project has progressed significantly since the March newsletter update. Archer Western sincerely thanks all residents for their patience during construction. Work completed so far includes:

- Installing a 24-foot sound wall around the work zone to minimize noise; the sound wall in Safety Harbor is 16 feet tall
- Adding sound dampening blankets to machinery in the work zone to further mitigate noise
- Installing the casing on both sides of the canal
- Fusing the HDPE pile in Safety Harbor
- Drilling a pilot hole from both sides of the canal to meet in the middle
- Drilling on the Oldsmar side with increasingly larger reamers

Horizontal directional drilling will continue through late April. The pipe pullback will begin tentatively in late April. Residents adjacent to the work zone will receive door hangers prior to the pullback; all other residents will receive notice from the neighborhood association, so please join the mailing list.
