GAVA President's Report December 2017

We had our first Board of Directors meeting since the spring in October. Because of the time that lapsed between meetings, we had many topics on the agenda. We managed to get through most items and decided to table a couple for our next meeting. Below are some of the highlights of the meeting:

> Bonnie Theal has done extensive research as it pertains to our 15 MPH speed limit. Many vehicles don't adhere to the limit and she is trying to find out if it is enforceable by the Sheriff's department. More information to follow.

The board authorized \$275 to repair the speaker system in the back half of the clubhouse.

The board authorized \$300 to purchase and install two additional security cameras. We had the capacity in our system to add two more. This will give us better visibility in the front of the clubhouse.

A request was made for five additional 8ft tables for the clubhouse. The board assigned TC Hite to work with the social club to determine the specific need.

We have one pool umbrella that was damaged from hurricane Irma, a request was made to repair, paint, or purchase new umbrellas. The board voted to table this request till our upcoming budget workshop.





The Court benches have been restained, all the other benches, tables, and planters have been pressure washed, painted with a coat of primer, and a new fresh coat of white paint. "I HEARD IT AT THE POOL"

Heard that our good fortune in being protected from major damage during our near miss with hurricane Irma was since our Gull Aire Village is sacred ground, such as in Indian burial grounds and the like. This can't be true can it?

RESEARCH: Intense (insert long groan here) research has uncovered some validity to this pool tale. Our fair city of Oldsmar was once home to some Tocobaga Indian villages. There were some burial mounds over in the Mobley preserve area back by where the old power plant stood, at the very end of Shore Drive. While the Tocobaga peoples were gone from this area by the early 1700's, those mounds survived until the 1930's or 40's but were then destroyed. Florida Power nor Duke Energy has never allowed anyone to dig or research on their 200+ acres that once housed that power plant. Numerous other villages were within what is now Oldsmar, including the part that is now Gull Aire Village, but not necessarily burial grounds. I'm not sure that is where our protection came from......but......there's the story.




