Please keep checking the bulletin board for upcoming events and any changes or additions.





More than one person in our pool has mentioned what they were billed for the *Tampa Bay Times* newspaper delivery. Their bills did not match each other's - nor was it the same as mine. Am I misguided in thinking that all "Gull-Airians" pay the same price for delivery of the newspaper?

<u>RESEARCH</u>...... This Reporter has found at least six different rates charged to GAV *Tampa Bay Times* subscribers. While the TBT will advertise a "regular" rate of \$299 for seven-day a week delivery, no one ever pays <u>that</u> much....although some are close! One GAV resident paid \$275 for daily delivery as recently as last year. This Reporter paid \$124 last year....but was billed \$152 this year. Other rates friends have mentioned fall anywhere in-between.....leading me to surmise (jokingly but maybe not) that the TBT uses a dartboard to determine who gets charged what!!! Rates for Sunday only and Thurs-Sunday also vary but with not as great a discrepancy. I can only imagine how much the snow-bird/partial year charges fluctuate.

It is suggested that you never agree to Auto-Pay as the newspaper will charge you automatically whatever they want. Also, unless you are billed at the previous year's rate (or less), and you feel the increase is a bit too much, allow delivery to stop. Within 2 or 3 weeks, the TBT will call you and you can then enter into the "how low can you go" battle. Since we no longer have the option of threatening a switch to the (now defunct) *Tampa Tribune*, the only other option besides doing without the paper entirely is to not get delivery for 35 or more days and then sign up as a "new subscriber". As of this writing in late May, the "newbie" rates are \$121.86 for seven days, \$111.84 for Thurs-Sun and \$41.80 for Sunday only. How do they compare to your rates?

In that we are apparently the last generation that will be reading and holding an actual news<u>paper</u>, it is sad that we cannot get any semblance of consistent pricing for what many of us consider part of our morning ritual. Same paper....same delivery.....same price...NOT!
