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GAVA Board of Directors

President's Report



The board of directors conducted a special meeting in April that focused on our financial planning strategy for the next five years. The meeting was held as a workshop, the board as well as residents in the audience took part in identifying some key initiatives and needs that face our community. In the end the board voted to allocate future reserve fund monies to the following projects:

2017 – The board voted to address an immediate need. The clubhouse roof has been leaking and has met its life expectancy. Various roofing contractors inspected the roof and determined that a new roof was needed. After receiving multiple bids, the board allocated \$32,300 for a new roof.

2017/2018 – The clubhouse lawn. Much discussion centered around the condition of the lawn around the clubhouse. This communal area is the focal point of visitors that enter our community. Lack of water and the means to produce water on this area has taken its toll. We will be considering possibly a well, irrigation, and sod.

2019/2020 – Storage. For some time now we have been dealing with ways to create space for our storage needs. We have various closets and sheds that are constantly full. The sheds we have on our property need repair. Instead of adding temporary storage, we would be looking at eliminating our sheds and constructing one building that would satisfy our needs for years to come.

I would like to thank those that provided input during this exercise, especially Maryann Sieminski and Mickey Stewart who did extensive research regarding solving our storage issues in the future.



A HISTORY MINUTE

Did you know that our town's founder - Ransom Eli OLDS -was also the President of the Oldsmar State Bank for the brief time he was in Florida? Mr. Olds served as the town's bank President until he departed....sometime around 1925. The building he constructed to house the Oldsmar Bank is still standing, and is currently used by the Oldsmar City Council, the Oldsmar Historical Society, and the Upper Tampa Bay Chamber of Commerce. In 1919, shortly after the bank opened, the kindly Mr. Olds opened an account for each child in town.....in the amount of \$10! While there was a sparse population living here at the time, the gesture was one of a by-gone era that is unheard of today.

ENDANGERED GOLF CARTS

The City of Oldsmar has granted Gull Aire the **PRIVILEGE** of using our golf carts and a lot of our residents enjoy the luxury of riding thru the neighborhood or to the clubhouse. However, there are some residents who are endangering this convenience.

As summer approaches, grandchildren will be visiting, but they **DO NOT** belong behind the wheel of a golf cart – whether driving it or sitting on your lap. This is a violation of Article IV, Florida Code of Ordinances, Section 66-105. This ordinance states "**ALL** persons operating a golf cart (and that includes your grandbabies) must be in possession of a **VALID DRIVERS LICENSE**". And what "intelligent" grandparent would risk injury to a toddler by placing them on their lap while driving – would you do that in your automobile?

During the school spring break, there was a golf cart with 2 passengers riding in it and 1 young boy standing up in the back – there were no rear seats on the cart. He was just standing up and hanging on while they were driving thru the village. Under section 66-110 of the same Ordinance, it states "it is unlawful for any occupant to stand at any time while the golf cart is in motion". Also in that section it states "it is unlawful for a golf cart to be operated on city sidewalks" and the owner MUST have liability insurance against personal injury and damage to property relative to the operation of golf carts on designated city streets".

So, what is all the fuss about – the City has made it very clear that violations of the Florida Codes will result in **rescinding the golf cart designation FOR THE ENTIRE COMMUNITY – not just that driver!** The next time you witness a violation of these codes, mention to them that, in addition to breaking the law, they are putting the entire community at risk.

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

Hello Everyone.



Just thought I would drop a note and let you all know what we came upon on our neighborhood watch patrol last night.

At Tarpon Lane & Canal Way, on top of the storm drain, was a huge alligator. I almost hit him it was so dark and all of a sudden there he was. He was at least 6ft. in length. We called 911 but while waiting for the deputy and a trapper to arrive, the gator stood up and walked across the road and went back down into the spillway probably where he came from. We notified the Sherriff's office and, although deputies were dispatched, they cancelled the trapper. The gator was gone.

If you are walking your dog, riding your bike or just out after dark, please be careful and on the lookout. We haven't had any rains and all the ponds, spillways, etc. are dried up. The gators come out for water and can be found in the storm drains. Also, with garage doors open you just might find an unpleasant surprise.

One thing I must say when we need a Sheriff we have the best, they are here in no time. So don't be afraid to call 911 for an alligator.

We also talked to the deputy last night about kids running around in here at night. A couple of nights ago we came upon 4 teenagers (3 girls 1 boy) in a car at the clubhouse at 11:30 at night. I guestioned them and they said they were going swimming. I said the pool is closed at 11:00 and I ask them if they lived in here. They said her grandmother did but couldn't give me a name and started laughing. I told them to leave and out the entrance they went. The sheriff said if you see any teenagers in here and they do not belong, call 911. He said they are the ones that are stealing cars in the area. Teenagers in Gull Aire at night, when they aren't supposed to be, are up to no good.
