

I would like to thank fellow board member TC Hite for coordinating the volunteers who went door to door to capture the necessary votes to pass the amendment change regarding rental properties. As a reminder, this addition to our documents now prohibits new owners to rent their homes for at least one year. The final vote was 311 yes and 22 no.

You will see in this newsletter the board contact list for the various committees, clubs, and key functions that take place in our community. If you have a question or concern regarding one of those areas, you can contact the specific board member assigned to that function. That board member will be the point of contact for that group, resident, or other board member.

A visitor to our park narrowly escaped a traffic accident because we had a stop sign blocked by some overhanging branches from a tree on a resident's property. The following summary comes from Oldsmar code of ordinances: "Every owner of any tree overhanging any street right-of-way within the city shall prune the branches so that such branches shall not obstruct the view of any street intersection or impede the access of vehicles and shall maintain a clear space of eight feet above the surface of the sidewalk and fourteen feet above the surface of roadways." We have come across this many times with questions pertaining to who is the responsible party. The homeowner could be cited by the city for not following this section of the ordinances.

#### I HEARD IT at the POOL

Morning splashers have heard that our Board of Directors has approved between \$50,000 and \$70,000 to build a Pickle Ball court. This can't be true.....can it ?

<u>FACTS</u> No such proposal has been suggested. Such an expenditure, not necessarily because of the amount but because it would be a capital expenditure and not a repair, would require a 60% approval by residents.

FYI....Pickle Ball is played on a court smaller (20x44 feet) than a tennis court.....with a net......using paddles in-between a tennis and a ping-pong racket size ......with a sort of a wiffle ball. PB combines the elements of badminton, tennis, and ping-pong. The game is popular amongst the mature in age!

Could there be any interest in a Pickle Ball court here ?

Currently Gull Aire Village restricts ownership to at least one owner being at least 55 years of age. However, this was not always the case. In our infancy, children of any age were permitted to live here. In 1983, GAV became "an 18 and older" village. Somewhere around 1987 or 1988, GAV became a "55+ community".





#### FLAPJACKS!

If the name sounds familiar it is because their first location is located at 36287 US19, Palm Harbor and they have just recently opened their second location at the southeast corner of Mc Mullen Booth Road and SR580, Safety Harbor. As of this review, this location is only open for breakfast and lunch (7am-3pm). However, there are ongoing plans to be open for dinners also. Their Palm Harbor location is open daily (7am-9pm) and also serves dinner.

As you can see in the photo, the blueberry crepes are large with "a lot" of blueberry filling. They have the usu-

al breakfast items – eggs, omelets, Flapjacks' skillet dishes, biscuits and gravy, pancakes, crepes, waffles and frittatas. For lunch, choices include soups, salads, sandwiches and burgers. Prices are comparable to other restaurants in the area. I tried but was unable to finish my large order of crepes and when I order them the next time, I will request a little less of the blueberry filling.

how to cook fish and this is done perfectly". I said I would not eat raw fish and be sick. His answer – " that's not my problem" and walked away. The message wanted us to call 844-711-3211 which is an area code in Mexico. This is an obvious scam. Microsoft will never call to alert you to a problem and a valid Windows Operating System Activation Key will never expire.

#### NIGHT WALKERS -

Several neighbors have commented that, when they are driving back into village at night, they encounter residents walking their pets in total darkness. The lighting in our community is not the "brightest", so please use COMMON SENSE and wear light colored clothing, reflective gear or carry a lit flashlight.

If you are not carrying a flashlight, you obviously aren't able to see and clean up your animals "deposits"!

Our sheds are filling up with wonderful treasures for our residents to discover.


